Buckland Review of Autism Employment

Earlier this year we were invited to join a roundtable organised by the Legal Neurodiversity Network at Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer's London office with Sir Robert Buckland MP and a team from the Department of Work and Pensions as part of the Buckland Review of Autism Employment. Our trustee Jane Pierce was invited to speak about Autism Forward's work meeting the crucial gap in funding and support for autistic people making the transition into employment. Other speakers included Rachel Pearson from our partner AS Mentoring and several young neurodivergent lawyers who shared their experiences and suggested creative ideas to remove barriers to employment to autistic people seeking jobs and remaining in the legal profession.

The Legal Neurodiversity Network is a fast-growing network of neurodivergent employees, partners and allies working in the UK legal services sector. They currently have over 55 organisations from all over the UK as members. These include all the 'Magic Circle' firms, The Law Societies of England and Wales and of Scotland, Lexxic and Neurodiversity in Law. Autism Forward Beneficiaries

We have now awarded over 330 grants for mentoring support and continue to see encouraging employment outcomes for our grant holders across the country. Over 70% of the job seekers we have supported since April this year are already in paid or voluntary employment and 95% of our current clients reported that the mentoring support had helped improve their self-confidence and understanding of their strengths and challenges. We continue to receive excellent feedback on the support we fund, as demonstrated by recent comments from some of our clients:
